Thank you for giving us the opportunity to serve you. Since 1955, Sky Ranch staff members have been focused on creating and maintaining a safe and secure environment that promotes the safety of our guests.

We believe in the practice of Safety First. Everything starts here.

Standards of Excellence

Sky Ranch exceeds the industry standards for safety protocols in many metrics. Our goal is to provide an outstanding experience for you and your group and our team is ready to assist you at every opportunity as we endeavor to exceed your expectations.

We have a group of dedicated staff members who live on the property and are prepared to assist with any emergency or request, from the smallest preference to a challenging opportunity.

We are pleased to maintain a close relationship with the local authorities, who routinely patrol the area near Sky Ranch, both outside of camp and near the cabins. These trusted officers are committed to serving the community and can be counted on for assistance if needed.

We recommend that everyone follow practices that are consistent with an appropriate response to interactions encountered during a visit to a place of public accommodation, (hotel, malls, parks, etc.) These recommendations include:

- Please lock your windows and door when you retire for the night. Lock your doors when your group leaves the cabin.
- The practice of the Buddy System is encouraged. Children/ youth should be supervised by an adult at all times.
- Lock your vehicle and conceal any items left inside.
- Please do not share the Sky Ranch gate code with others.
- Please report any suspicious behavior or individuals to a staff member as soon as possible.
- Do not leave expensive equipment outside of your cabin or in public areas. Please place these items inside the trunk of your car or your cabin and be sure to lock the cabin when you leave.
- In case of an immediate threat, please call 911 immediately and then notify Sky Ranch staff by using the radio available in the office or by calling the Sky Ranch On Call Emergency number at 903.352.0916.

We encourage you to be mindful of your surroundings and to communicate any concerns with us as soon as possible. Our goal is to serve with excellence and we look forward to assisting you.

Full-Time Professional Team

Each full-time staff member undergoes a thorough interview process, a full set of background checks which includes a check against the national sex offender registry and references checks at time of hire.

Every staff member on camp is trained and expected to never be alone in a private setting with a camper from any group.

Full-time staff receives annual performance reviews overseen by a member of our Executive Team. Moreover, the entire Executive Team of Sky Ranch, including our CEO, participates in the continual monitoring and quality assurance checks of all camp ministries.

Sky Ranch practices daily monitoring of all activities through a system of checks and balances. Ministry Team Leaders, Activity Managers, and a team of seasonal staff provide constant monitoring of all camp activities.

In compliance with Texas, Oklahoma, and Colorado State law, if any of our staff become aware of potential or actual camper abuse, we report any suspicions or information to the appropriate agency.

Professional Activity Training and Standards

Sky Ranch is an American Camp Association accredited camp. ACA is an independent organization that establishes and evaluates standards and best practices for the camping industry. Our camps are visited and reviewed by fellow camp professionals trained as ACA visitors and graded against a set of standards established by ACA. Sky Ranch exceeds many of the standards set by ACA.

Rigorous hand washing, daily hygiene procedures, and a full-time housekeeping team help us protect against the spread of illness.

When open for camper use, trained American Red Cross Lifeguards are posted at every water activity.

Staff who lead ropes activities are trained through an Accredited ACCT organization.

All campers must wear a life jacket at water front activities.

Medical Information

Sky Ranch is located close to a medical clinic and near Lake City, CO and near Gunnison, CO which provides a Level One trauma center that can handle all emergencies. In case of an emergency, guests should call 911. A telephone is available in the office, maintenance shop and dining hall.

All lifeguards are trained to use the Automated External Defibrillator. Sky Ranch has an AED in Town Hall mounted on the North wall.

Outstanding Facilities

All ropes courses and ropes equipment are inspected annually by a certified Association of Challenge Course Technologies (ACCT) vendor.

Our gates are controlled and are monitored and closed at 10pm each night. Please refrain from climbing on or over any fences.

Please help us by watching your children when near the irrigation ditch located here on camp. Please refrain from drinking from the ditch and all rivers, lakes, and streams. The large rock on camp is not for climbing. It is shaley and will break out from under any climbers.

Kid Friendly Food Service Standards

Sky Ranch's kitchens are regulated by the Colorado Department of State Health Services in the same way public restaurants are regulated. While we are not peanut free, we have limited the amount of peanut products in our food.

Fruits and/or vegetables are integrated into the menus at Sky Ranch, and we also include a full salad bar with all lunch and dinner meals.
