Mail from family and friends is one of the highlights of camp! Campers can receive letters every day (M-F), packages from home on Tuesday and Thursday, and SkyPacks on a variety of days!

Here's everything you need to know:

- You may bring up to two packages (shoebox-size or smaller).
- Pack your camper's favorite things inside - snacks, small gifts or games, notes, etc. Please do not send gum or snacks that contain common allergens, such as peanuts.
- Drop off letters and packages at the Legacy Center on Sunday (don't leave them in the car)!
- Snail mail won't reach your camper in time, so please do not send items via UPS, FedEx, or USPS.
- Label every package like this:
 - Camper's full name
 - Cabin number
 - Delivery Day (Mon-Fri for letters, Tues/Thurs for packages)

IMPORTANT:

Medications

If your child will be taking medication while at camp, the medication will be stored in our health center and dispensed by a licensed health professional. All medications (both prescription and over-the-counter) must be checked in when you drop off your camper. Here's an overview – for more information, check out the Summer Prep page!

Important Information:

- Drop off meds in the Legacy Center on Sunday
- All medication must be in original packaging (no pill containers)
- Make sure the medicine is within date and not expired
- Rescue inhalers and EpiPens are the only meds kept with the counselor

FULL-TIME PROFESSIONALS AROUND THE CLOCK CARE

The safety and well-being of every guest is overseen by a dedicated team of full-time professionals who serve year-round. From comprehensive staff training and daily leadership oversight to established safety protocols, every aspect of camp is designed with your camper's care in mind. During the summer, our Health Centers are staffed 24 hours a day by registered nurses, paramedics, nurse practitioners, and physicians, providing expert medical care whenever it's needed.



ABUSE PREVENTION

Sky Ranch partners with MinistrySafe, a nationally recognized leader in abuse prevention. Regardless of experience or years of service, every team member completes annual training, learning to identify concerning behavior, maintain appropriate boundaries, and help prevent situations that could lead to abuse. All staff must also pass a comprehensive background check to be employed.
